Mississippi Surveillance Overdose System (MS-SOS)

For the Month of February 2024

Mississippi non-fatal overdoses in the form of a monthly rapid alert report is an information sharing strategy to help communities reduce illicit and prescription drug misuse. Non-fatal overdose responses in hospital emergency departments and in communities by emergency medical services are reported per public safety district. Public health and public safety partners can review areas which may need additional resources to minimize further drug overdoses.

- Whether the number of non-fatal overdoses has met or exceeded the pre-established monthly thresholds is determined using standard deviation principles. Public Safety Districts highlighted in red have exceeded the pre-established ED and EMS data thresholds and yellow-highlighted regions are equal to preestablished thresholds.
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Runs data does not capture stimulants. Column expressed as, "-".
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Runs as reported to biospatial on 03/18/2024.
